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2026 School Contributions

Attached to this newsletter is information regarding the 2026 School Contribution payments. These contributions help the school cover the costs of the essential supplies required for delivering our educational programs.

Unfortunately, the Department of Education's School Savings Bonus initiative (SSB) will not be continuing next year, however any funds from 2025 that have not been spent will remain credited to your students' accounts and are able to be used towards camps, sports and excursion costs.

Any families that have a Health Care Card (not Medicare) with their child's name on it are eligible to apply for a CSEF (Camp, Sports and Excursions Fund) payment. Please see our office staff for forms if you think you may be eligible.

Building Update

It has been very exciting to see the works begin on our building development! The students loved watching the demolition of the old Junior Wing earlier this term. This all happened very fast and since then the work has been focussed on the preparation of the site for the new building. We expect to see the slab being poured in the new year and then it will be all systems go with construction! It will be exciting to watch the progress occur in the new year. For 2026, all classes will begin in the main building. Once the first stage of the project is completed during the year, we will have to move into the new spaces ready for the second stage of the development.
