Dear Clayton South Primary School families,

The most important skill our children need to learn during their time with us is the ability to read. Our brains don't naturally learn to read in the same way we learn to walk, talk and listen. As babies, our children can hear our voices and begin to interpret what we are saying, regardless of language, and by about the age of 2 years old, begin to converse with us. The brain is not wired to do this with reading.

Therefore, as educators, we need to explicitly and systematically, teach the foundational skills of reading to the students. The first element of this is called Phonological Awareness. This is the ability to hear the individual phonemes (sounds) in words, and isolate beginning, middle and ending phonemes, recognise and create rhyming words, delete individual phonemes and add individual phonemes. We use a program called Heggerty in our Prep – 2 classrooms, which takes as little as 8 minutes per day, and ensures the students are being exposed to Phoneme Awareness and 'having a go' as a class. Research suggests that students with little to no Phonological Awareness will struggle with reading in the later years. We are tackling that problem from day 1 of Prep.



The second important element for our young readers is phonics. We use a program called Little Learners Love Literacy (LLLL) from Prep -2, where the students are taught the individual phonemes (sounds) matched to the graphemes (letters) in a sequential order, beginning with the sounds for s, a, p, t, i, m, f and c. From there, the students will practice blending these sounds together to make words such as

cat, sat, Sam, cap and Tim. We use decodable readers across the whole school (LLLL in the Junior school, and chapter decodable books in the Senior school with those that need them). During Term 4 when our Preps returned on-site, we noticed a huge difference in their reading abilities once we began to implement this program, so we are excited to get a full year of teaching in this year and extend our 'little learners'.



The next elements to becoming skilled readers are improving fluency (expression, reading rate, accuracy), and comprehension. We will also be working on their language comprehension which includes vocabulary, background knowledge and ...Continued over page language structures.

All staff (including myself, the teachers, and the Education Support staff) have been busy learning all about how children learn to read, and we have been modifying our practice to reflect the over 40 years of research that has gone into studying how the brain learns to read. So you can rest assured, we are doing all we can to improve the learning outcomes for your children in reading.

Our tutor, Kyla Golledge, will be working with all students deemed 'at risk' in reading from Year 1-6, from Monday. This will occur over Terms 1 and 2, where the students will see Miss Golledge for approximately 3 x 20 minute sessions each week. We are hopeful this extra tuition will benefit our readers who need it the most.

Next newsletter, I will discuss our writing program, followed by how we teach numeracy here at Clayton South Primary School.




#### Year 5/6 SCIENCE INCURSION
