Dear Clayton South Primary School families,

In our previous newsletter, I gave a detailed description of how we teach reading here at CSPS and how we train each of the 5 important skills to becoming a proficient reader. If you missed it, please check it out on the school website. This week, I would like to discuss the writing practices we use in all classrooms.

Writing is such a subjective curriculum area, so it is important that all staff have the necessary background knowledge of the Victorian Curriculum and what is required developmentally at each progression of the curriculum. As a staff, we have broken down the writing curriculum into the areas of; handwriting, spelling, punctuation, sentences and paragraphs, part of speech and grammar, fluency and focus, vocabulary, and literary devices. We then explicitly teach each of these areas following a progression from Prep to Year 6, so that we can extend students, but also work to each students' point of need.

We teach each of the 9 text types, or genres, over the course of the year. If a year level is not developmentally ready to begin writing in a particular genre, we will still expose them to exemplary writing of that text type, to begin to prepare them for later years. The 9 text types we cover in Primary School are; recount, description, information report, narrative, procedure, exposition, explanation, discussion and response.

By mastering each of these text types, our students will be ready for secondary school where they will combine text types in order to create an essay. Our job is to ensure the students are ready for this when they move on from Clayton South Primary School.

As a staff, we have begun our own Professional Learning journey into writing. Last week in our Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) we analysed what a narrative and exposition writing piece should look like from Prep to Year 6. The idea will be that students will have access to their results and teachers can provide timely, specific and relevant feedback to each student. Students will then create their own writing goals to work towards. Staff can also delve deeper into the needs of the entire cohort, their own class, and individual students, to maximise learning time, plan accordingly, and measure growth.


